At the end of year one I will know and remember...



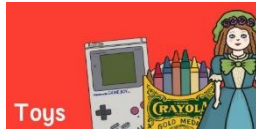
- The plot happened in 1605.
- The plotters were Catholic and felt they were being treated unfairly by the King, who was Protestant.
- King James I was the King of England.
- The Gunpowder Plot was a plot to kill King James I and his government by blowing up the Houses of Parliament on 5<sup>th</sup> November 1605.
- The plot failed.
- On the 5<sup>th</sup> of November each year, people burn bonfires and light fireworks to commemorate the failure of the plot.
